SAO Report

- Second round of vaccine held last week 1242 dosage were given
- Distribution of the voucher was completed last week
- Hamlet and Ikurraq Food Distribution will be holding a drive-up food distribution of caribou meat, char and chicken breast on Saturday February 27, 2021 in front of the Hamlet office.

- SAO, Public works Foreman, and equipment manager are looking at equipment replacements. They are currently gathering more information before they can will bring the works committee together. They are looking at procurement options as there are significant increase in equipment prices.
- Draft budget is being worked on by Adine and the SAO to bring to the Minister of finance and his committee.
- Nunavut Water board holding public session at Sinik on Thursday February 23, 2021 to review the intake line being moved from Char river to lower landing lake.

#### Councillor Kowmuk

Mentioned about the 1200 people who took the moderna vaccine.

### Councillor Merritt

- Asked the SAO had the chance to talk to CPHO or the Minister, to mention about the people Arviat having a lay over in Rankin to go to Winnipeg. They ask for their children to go to the airport to say hi to meet them. Asking if there are precaution or rapid test for people from Arviat before they can fly out. He is concerned about people from Rankin being contacted with the virus.
- He mentioned about the Rape kits being unavailable across the country. He is concerned that if a community does not have the kit and having to travel to Winnipeg or Thompson to get the test done, they might lose the evidence. Perhaps the SAO can get an information from the RCMP.
