ValOre Metals Corp (ValOre) is planning an exploration program at its Angilak Project in 2022. This work will involve 2 phases: Spring (mid April to end of May) and Summer program (July-September).

**Responsibilities:**

Reporting to the site geologist, the Sampling Assistants will be responsible for the following:

- Performing tasks as directed by the site geologist to facilitate the sampling procedures during rig operation, which will include;
  - Lifting of sample buckets (~25kg)
  - Pouring contents of the sample buckets through a sample splitter
- Helping to seal and organize completed (split) samples in piles beside the drill, or as directed by the site geologist
- Additional duties could include assisting the site geologist with technical measurements and data input, and other tasks as required.
- Complying with all of ValOre’s camp, code of conduct, and environmental policies, as well as being committed to safe work practices

**Knowledge, Skills & Experience:**

- Be in good physical condition, capable of lifting and carrying over short distances sample buckets weighing up to 25kg
- Able to work long hours of approximately 12-hour shifts
- Able to work on rotation that will be no shorter than 3-weeks in/1-week out
- Able to take direction and supervision
