ValOre Metals Corp (ValOre) is planning an exploration program at its Angilak Project in 2022. This work will involve 2 phases: Spring (mid April to end of May) and Summer program (July-September).

Responsibilities:

Reporting to the Camp Manager, the Wildlife Monitor will be responsible for:

- Providing safety and hazard assessments in advance of field workers
- Reporting any wildlife close to the site
- Observing and reporting any wildlife migration
- Following the KIA Mobile Caribou Conservation Measures
- Informing the need to stop operations according to the KIA Mobile Caribou Conservation Measures
- Complying with all of ValOre's camp, code of conduct, and environmental policies, as well as being committed to health and safety work practices

Knowledge, Skills & Experience:

- The wildlife monitor should bring his own firearm with a valid FAC.
- Able to work long hours of approximately 12-hour shifts
- Able to work on rotation that will be no shorter than 3-weeks in/1-week out
- Able to take direction and supervision
- Able to perform physically demanding work
- Strong communication, teamwork and collaboration skills
- Strong observational skills required (able to recognize abnormal operational conditions in camp and immediately report them to the camp manager)
- Solid time management and organizational skills
